The 33rd FIAP Congress Seoul and Gyeongju, the Republic of Korea August 22 - 28, 2016

South Korea (officially the Republic of Korea) is a sovereign state in the southern part of the Korean Peninsular with the population of almost 50 million. The capital and the largest city is Seoul, with a population of approximately 10 million.

After the Korean war in 1950 and in the decades that followed, the South Korean economy grew significantly and the country has been transformed into a major economy, a full democracy and a regional power in East Asia. South Korea is a presidential republic consisting of seventeen administrative divisions and is a developed country with a very high standard of living. It is Asia's fourth largest economy and the world's 11th largest economy. The economy is export-driven, with production focusing on electronics, automobiles, ships, machinery, petrochemicals and robotics, South Korea is a member of United Nations, WTO, and OECD. It is also a founding member of APEC and the East Asia Summit.

The Photo Artists Society of Korea (PASK) will host the 33rd FIAP Congress on August 22 ~ 28, 2016. The Congress will be held at the Grand Ambassador Hotel (http://grand.amatel.com) for two nights, in Seoul and the Hyundai Hotel (http://www.hyundaihotel.com) for 4 nights, in Gyeongju, Korea.

From modern skyscrapers and neon lights to Buddhist temples, palaces and pagodas, Seoul is a fascinating mix of old and new. A hub of business, culture and finance both within South Korea and internationally. Seoul houses the headquarters for some of the world's largest corporations. It also has one of the world's best subway systems - the easiest way to get around in this densely populated area. For the best view of Seoul. head to the tower on Namsan, one of the mountains encircling the city.

On the way to Gyeongju, we will stop at the new buildings of Gyeongsangbukdo Province, and visit Andong Hahoe folk village (UNESCO World Heritage Cultural Village). The whole village is designated as an important center for Korean folklore crafts and culture. The village craftsmen still make the Hahoetal dance masks. Andong is considered a piece of Korean living history and Queen Elizabeth of England asked to visit this wonderful folk village when she visited Korea.

Gyeongju was the one thousand year old capital of the Silla Dyanisty. Here, the brilliant Siilla culture was in full bloom. Numerous historic relics are preserved in the old Silla capital city. The whole city of Gyeongju is called a 'Museum without walls' because the city owns lots of valuable relics and has developed the city to show case these valuable and interesting relics. Gyeongju was designated as one of the World 10 Cultural Relics by the UNESCO.

The PASK provides all FIAP participants with various and convenient services so that they can get around the area easily and enjoy the sights and exhibits both in Seoul and Gyheongju. 
175 years of International

Photography

Photography celebrates its 175" anniversary

<u> 1839 - 2014 — </u>

On 30 July this year it will be 175 years since "photography" as an invention of Niepce and Daguerre was presented in Paris to the House of Representatives and donated to the world. This was the result of a report that François Arago (1786-1853), physicist and astrologer, had finalized on June 15, 1839 and that was explained by Gay-Lussac (1778-1850). King Louis-Philippe granted on August 7, 1839 his approval and as a result France offered on August 19 this invention of Photography unconditionally and without any restriction to the whole world.



So this date marked the beginning of the international photography.

The person who was considered as the inventor of photography and who effectively made the very first photograph known in the world, Joseph Nicephore Niepce, was meanwhile already deceased.

A camera, including the material to develop the pictures was that year on sale for 400 gold francs, which represented an eight-month salary of a worker. The entire installation weighed as much as 50 kg.

Throughout the world, this anniversary is celebrated in the course of this year.

After this text follows an article about the celebration of the 150th anniversary that was part of the FIAP Congress in Belgium in 1989, text that was translated by other federations of FIAP in at least eight languages after the Congress.

Note that on this occasion we could manage to gather some old photos including several originals, including the first color picture of the world, namely the original of Ducos du Hauron dating from 1869. Needless to say that insurance and safety requirements from leaving Paris to the exhibition Halls in Mons were very drastic.

Hippolyte Bayard obtained the first image on paper and realized on June 24, 1839, the first exhibition of photographs on paper. So he was certainly also a pioneer, but had not the political connections of Daguerre and was thus unable to obtain an income with his invention. Therefore, he realized his "Self Portrait" in 1841 with his process that he called Calotype; that picture is definitely the first protest photograph. We were also able to obtain it for the exhibition at the FIAP Congress of 1989






Given by the author at the precise time when, 150 years ago on August 19 at 15 hours, François Arago, from the height of the podium of the Academy of Sciences released to the world the process of Daguerre and Niepce.

Some 30 countries are represented in this Gothic Hall. I thank all of you who have come to Mons on this memorable day. We wish to commemorate the capital event of the declaration of François Arago who donated photography to the whole world exactly at this day and hour just 150 years ago. The French Academy of Sciences in 1839 surely never imagined that its session should be commemorated here and before such an international audience.

It is often pleasant to look back to the past and remember our youth and the good memories, wishing the old times could come back. That is the object of the exhibition "150 Years of International Photography".





La table servie. N. Nièpce, Anno 1822



Photography is commemorating its 150th anniversary all over the world, and yet its inventor died 156 years ago. When was photography really invented? It is impossible to reply to this question. The invention was a slow process; the results of Niepce, Daguerre, Bayard, Fox Talbot were the fruit of many years of research.

But one date is precisely known: it is the date of the famous declaration made by François Arago, scientist and member of the French Parliament. Before this date of 19 August 1839, Daguerre, Fox Talbot and all others jealously kept their secrets, and thus photography remained in the hand of 2 or 3 people excluding any rapid evolution.

Now let's review the history of photography of 150 years ago.

The possibility of obtaining temporary images in the camera obscura was known since the end of 18th century.

However, they served no useful purpose since the images could not be fixed and turned completely black once they were exposed to daylight. In 1802 Wedgwood published a paper on his disappointing attempts. The experiments of Nicéphore Niepce seem to date back to 1814. In 1816 Niepce succeeded in obtaining the first images on paper coated with silver chloride.


These first experiments, of which nothing is left, represented what Niepce saw from the window of the attic, which served as his laboratory. The images were of course negatives, but even at that stage he and his brother already had the idea of reversing them to positives by copying. It was by using Bitumen of Judea that he produced in 1822 the very first photograph known to the world. Let's point out that the procedure did not make use of silver.

Thus Niepce had found the way to make images permanent. However the results were not perfect and you can see that for yourself when you visit the exhibition at the Museum later, and look at the picture entitled "La table servie". For Niepce's pictures an exposure time of some 8 hours was necessary! Niepce was a very modest man, living out in the province and one can regret that his work did not get better known immediately.

In 1829 Niepce and Daguerre formed an association in order to exploit together the photographic methods. Niepce wrote to Daguerre in 1829: "The invention which I made and which I named Heliography, consists in reproducing spontaneously, through the action of light, and keeping all the shades of black down to white, images received in the camera obscura". Niepce unfortunately never benefited from his invention, because he died in 1833.

Daguerre was lucky to stumble onto the process of fixing the latent image in mercury vapours. One can read from the contracts concluded between Daguerre and Isidore Niepce, son and heir of Nicéphore, that the advantages of the process are "to reproduce images about 60 to 80 times more promptly than the old procedures". This to us means that the material had become more sensitive.

The speed of the process was what most impressed the general public at the time: it had become possible to shoot a picture in 6 minutes, providing it was in summertime and full sunlight. We are no longer used to these long exposure times, and it is good to keep them in mind when examining pictures made in that period.

Thus Daguerre disposed of a process, which was quite refined, and he could start commercializing it, which he did with the help of Arago. It is a known fact that Daguerre was the first one to announce his invention on 7 January 1939.

In that same year both Henry Fox Talbot in Britain and Hippolyte Bayard in France claim to be the first to have fixed images "so that they can be conserved and can even stand full sunlight" as they said. Bayard obtained the first permanent image on paper and thus gained a lead on his direct opponent. On 24 June 1839 Hippolyte Bayard made the very first exhibition of photographs on

paper. But these two pioneers. Fox Talbot and Bayard, did not develop the latent image, and because of the long exposure times and the roughness of the paper support their procedure was no match for the Daguerreotype.

In 1841 Fox Talbot takes out a patent on a procedure of development, which he calls the Calotype, and which gave the start for the whole negative-positive photography, which we know to day. In 1844 he publishes in London an album "The Pencil of Nature", containing 24 Calotypes, each with a short explanation. For one of the images the text reads "The chief object of the present work is to place on record some of the early beginnings of a new art, before the period, which we trust is approaching, of its being brought to maturity by the aid of British talent". Thus Fox Talbot was maybe the first person to allude to the future of photography in the sense of a means of artistic expression.

I cite Arago in the French parliament on June 15 1839: "You all know, and many of you have been able to experience this, that after some fifteen years of perseverant and expensive research, Mr. Daguerre was able to fix images in the camera obscura, and thus create in some 4 or 5 minutes, by the power of light, drawings, in which the objects mathematically retain their form even to the most minute details, and in which the effects of linear perspective and of degradation of tones due to aerial perspective are rendered with a delicacy unknown up till now. "As you can see the word "photograph" did not exist, Arago was speaking of "drawings".

And Arago went further: "It is not necessary to insist here on the utility of such an invention. One easily sees which resources, which new ease it can bring to the study of sciences. And with relation to art, the services it can render cannot be evaluated".

And Arago finished his speech by exhorting the members of parliament "... you will never leave to any foreign nation the glory of donating to the scientific and artistic world one of the most wonderful inventions". Arago was right, and I have no doubt that all of you here in this hall agree with him to call photography a "wonderful invention".

150 years ago exactly, that is on August 19, exactly at the time we are gathered here, François Arago from the tribune of the Science Academy made public the procedure Niepce and Daguerre invented, and publicly announced that France donated "to the scholarly and artistic world one of the most wonderful inventions which his country was honoured to posses". From this speech, which was partly improvised, there is no exact text left. But I can cite some of the words of Arago: "we are proud to bestow this wonderful invention on the whole world". Daguerre and Isidore Niepce were present in the noble assembly. The generous donation of photography to the whole world was the start for international photography and for its soaring development.

Photography can find many applications. One can easily see that remaining in the hand of one individual it can never have many outlets. Rendered public however, it can find a wealth of applications among draughtsmen, scientists, journalists and artists. In the possession of a single individual it would remain stationary, whereas as a public goods it can grow and develop with **the** help of all. Thus must have been the gist of the speech of Arago, 150 years ago.

The day of August 19 1839 was a memorable one. Hundreds of people got into the adventure and became photographers. In a few weeks time the paper of Daguerre went around the world and was translated into many languages. The first Daguerreotype of the New World was produced 28 days after Arago's declaration even though the fastest ships took 15 days to cross the Atlantic. One document presented at this exhibition shows that in September 1839 already a Belgian was producing Daguerreotypes.

Beginning with the event which we commemorate at this exact date, the whole world, and not just three men, is at work for photography. As a result this art has had the incredible evolution we know to day.

150 years ago, the scientist Gay-Lussac said about Daguerre's invention:

"Without in any way trying to diminish the merits of this beautiful invention, we have to point out that the palette of the artist is not very rich in colours, since **it is** composed of black and white only. The image in natural and varied colours will remain for a long time to come, and maybe even for always, a challenge to human inventiveness. "This goes to show how important photography was considered to be, but how inaccessible colours appeared".

And yet, even as early as 1868 two scientists, Louis Ducos du Hauron and Charles Cros, working quite separately, found a procedure of trichromy based on primary colours, which permitted to photograph in colours. By a strange coincidence they announced their invention on the same day at the "Société Française de Photographie".

However, the sensitive materials had not sufficiently been developed; they only reacted to blue light. It would take until 1907 to see Louis Lumière launch on the market the very first colour plates, called "Autochromes".

In this second part of the 19th century, photography immerses the public in the excitement and gradually accesses to all levels of society. People cue up in front of photographic studios, and in the year 1852 several tens of thousands of portraits are produced, thus transforming little by little the whole way of life of people.

In 1839 researchers were isolated but inventors already were jealous of each other and tried to get the better. As things stand to day, development and progress can no longer come from a single person, but only from research teams operating in important laboratories. But still rivalry and jealousy prevail, now among the large commercial firms.

There are innumerable facets to photography and it has been developed over a long period already. It would indeed take a very wide angle to survey all its applications. And how could one focus correctly so as to see clearly the whole history?

This exhibition may give you a glimpse. Photography is a witness to the past and the present. It sends us messages and information from the past. This exhibition goes to prove that. It is our duty to also send to future generations the reflection of our present times. But photography has many functions. It must not in all cases faithfully represent material reality. It can also show the authors feelings and moods. Photography is a means of creation, an art. In 1892 Alfred Maskell already wrote: "we demand freedom; the freedom to express our thoughts and impressions in the *way we* deem best suited, the freedom to use all the essential methods of photography, i.e. the methods which are linked to the action of light upon sensitive materials. Our works will speak for themselves and will carry within themselves either their own glory or their condemnation."

I wish to end with these words: we must continue the work of the pioneers of photography. It is up to **all** of us...

JIPF activities in 2015


1. The Omani-Turkish Joint Photography Exhibition









3. International Exhibition (Oman and China)







In order to develop the skills of young people in photography world, the FIAP Exhibitions Center in the Middle East worked hard to organize three events during 2015, including:

1. Canon Photo Competition Exhibition

The Photographic Society of Oman held the exhibition for Canon's photo competition in collaboration with (GENETCO Canon). This competition came for the young Omani photographers. The judging panel received 101 photographs by 28 photographers. They selected the first 3 winners in the first category of under 15 years and another 3 winners from the second category under 20 years. The competition was unique in the sense that all photos were submitted in RAW format with no processing or retouching allowed to be done, this is to Ensure that the photographers are capable of capturing the light as best as they can.

2. The Youth Photographer Corner

The Youth Photographer corner care about the art of photography and its consider as new fresh recourse that Muscat exhibition functions 2015 shows, associated with the Omani cooperation of art of photography. This corner includes lots of functions such as some photos that has been captured with children during Muscat exhibition in early years, establishing a mini warehouse for children to learn the basics techniques of the photography art for instance to recognize the camera, knowing how to use it in a correct way, and the way of capturing the moment. The corner also contains a studio for children to learn how to be a professional photographer.

3. Summer Photographic Training

The aim of the summer photographic training, is to introduce the essential photographing and all of its kinds, and to give different type of information that any photographer should know and how to deal with the camera. It also aims to educate the beginners with the equipment's and different type of cameras and the nature of the photography and how to use the lenses and also how to function the lenses in opening and closing it quickly, how to control the photo arts, mechanism to preserve numerical files, and to criticism the photos of the beginners. This summer training is divided into two units, age wise from 7 – 17 years old, and 18 and above years old, this training consist classes of essential and different type of photographing, an additional discussion session for contestant journey to apply the practical side of training. The Omani Cooperation of photography art has established this summer training in holidays season for the students in schools and colleges, where in 2015 there were about 9 training in Muscat region, Dhofar and Buraimi.



I think it is important to have photographic goals and entering FIAP approved salons exposes one to some superb photography that one, may someday, be able to emulate.





10th FIAP CLUBS WORLD CUP 2015 CEREMONY

The Hellenic Photographic Society (HPS) and the International Federation of Photographic Art (FIAP) jointly organised the "10th FIAP Clubs World Cup 2015" award ceremony on Saturday 27th February 2016. Our guests from various countries, like United Kingdom, Finland, Cyprus and Turkey, as well as the whole FIAP Board of Directors started the day with a guided tour of the Acropolis Museum by Mr George Guizaris, a qualified tourist guide and dedicated member of HPS, who demonstrated high level of knowledge; historic and artistic. Our guests, together with FIAP and HPS board members had a meal at the Museum's restaurant, where a symbolic present with traditional Greek products was given to each one of the invited persons. After this meal, all the guests were guided to the traditional neighborhood of Plaka for photographic quests. The exhibition was held at the Cultural Centre of the Municipality of Athens, Melina Merkouri, from 26 until 28 February 2016, where 47 photos were exhibited.

During an impressive event, the 10th FIAP Clubs World Cup award ceremony took place at the first floor of the Cultural Centre and all distincted photographers and Photo Clubs were awarded. The first floor of the Cultural Centre had been specifically selected as it resembles a theatre scene and also reminds of a typical old neighborhood of Athens.

The hall was crowded and a great number of representatives from the photographic world took part, as well as HPS honorary presidents, its branches representatives and many international photographers. The whole board of Directors of the FIAP with its President Mr Ricardo Busi and the Director of FIAP World Cup for Clubs Mr Jacky Martin were present.

The ceremony commenced with our President Mr Spyros Iatropoulos' speech, which referred to the 62- year cooperation of HPS and FIAP, the successful contribution of HPS to the route of FIAP through Mr Xenofon Argyris as its President and Mr Ioannis Lykouris, currently from the position of the Secretary General. FIAP President referred to the past organizations that HPS executed successfully and honored the service of Mr Xenofon Argyris, where an extensive applause followed from the audience. Later that night, a slide show of the awarded works was projected and the awarding ceremony followed. The representative of the Smethwick Photographic Society Mr Roger Parry was present and received the World Cup; several British and Turkish photographers received their awards, as well.

In addition, the FIAP Vice President Mr Freddy Van Gilbergen together with the FIAP President awarded the annual artistic FIAP distinctions to the Greek photographers, increasing the total number of the Greek international photographers who take part in several international competitions and Biennials. Coincidently, both HPS President Mr Spyros Iatropoulos and FIAP President Mr Ricardo Busi were awarded with the EFIAP/platinum distinction.

All the FIAP board members, as well as the Director of FIAP Clubs World Cup Mr Jacky Martin, received an HPS commemorative plaque each, honoring the 62-year continuous cooperation and support as an official FIAP member. FIAP granted our Photographic Society two very important awards; one crystal award for the successful organization of the 10th FIAP Club's World Cup ceremony and one anniversary award for the continuous cooperation. The ceremony ended with commemorative photos of the awarded international photographers and with the FIAP and HPS board members.

After the award ceremony, both HPS and FIAP Presidents moved to the Cultural Centre's ground level, inaugurating the exhibition with the awarded photos of the 10th FIAP Clubs World Cup. This collection was a great presentation of modern digital works.



ACCOLADES AWARDED IN 9TH EMIRATES PHOTOGRAPHY COMPETITION

'Love on the cooking bench' portfolio by Chengliang Liu from China scoops Grand Prize

Manarat al Saadiyat to host exhibition of winners' work and engaging programme of activities

Abu Dhabi, U.A.E. 28 March, 2016: The finest international, regional and Emirati photographers have been recognised at a glittering awards ceremony for the ninth edition of the Emirates Photography Competition (EPC), one of the most important professional photography competitions in the world.

From an astounding selection of more than 30,000 submissions, the grand prize was awarded to Chinese photographer Chengliang Liu for his 'Love on the cooking bench' portfolio of eight Environmental Portraits depicting domestic scenes shot within family kitchens of rural Chinese homes, earning Lui a FIAP gold medal and an AED100,000 cash prize.

The grand prize is awarded to the best work that presents innovative creative ideas in the main theme, this year signifying 'Family Album', which received 831 portfolio submissions.

Meanwhile Egyptian Marwa Seida won the Creative Prize for her collection of images reflecting 'Life', together with a AED50,000 prize and FIAP gold medal.

Held under the patronage of the International Federation of Photographic Art (FIAP), entries to the competition – the ninth in the annual series organised by Abu Dhabi Tourism & Culture Authority (TCA Abu Dhabi) – were received from 4,800 photographers representing 90 countries. A total of 18 prizes and 27 Honourable Mentions were awarded at the ceremony.

"The judging panel was astounded by the quality, depth and diversity of submissions for this ninth edition, ultimately selecting a grand prize winner from the main 'Family Album' theme which we feel captures genuine moments of family life, where the surroundings are used to amplify the emotion of the composition and complement the subject and emphasise its character," said Badar Al Nomani, from the TCA Abu Dhabi Arts Department.

Other winners in the Main Theme category include Dimitrious Markoglou whose work 'Loneliness' was awarded first prize, an FIAP gold medal and AED20,000; 'Soul' by Egyptian photographer Mohamed Nasr took home an FIAP silver medal and AED15,000 for second spot; with an FIAP Bronze medal and AED10,000 awarded to 'Indians Gypsies' by Saudi Arabian photographer, Abbas Alkhamis.

This year's main theme – 'Family Album' – was chosen to reflect the community values of the family, and connect a variety of individuals and cultural environments so as to serve modern, creative artistic ideas in the field of photography.

The winning photographs will go on show to the general public in a three-month exhibition, which opens on Monday 28 March and runs until 13 July at Manarat Al Saadiyat exhibition centre on Saadiyat Island, Abu Dhabi. Over 200 selected images from winners' works will be exhibited in 10 sections.

In addition to attracting entries from an international pool of talent, the competition also aims to promote photography in the UAE through the highly coveted Nour Ali Rashid Award for the Emirati Photographer and the Emirati Photo Award categories which focus on the characteristic environmental and cultural components of the UAE.

The ninth edition's Nour Ali Rashid Award for the Emirati Photographer winning portfolio consisting of four black and white images 'Identity is a choice', 'Beyond the masks', 'Restraining hands' and 'Something between facts' by UAE photographer Ahlam Al Ahmed was selected from over 750 entries, earning her a FIAP gold medal and AED50,000. Al Ahmed's work, along with other submissions from talented local photographers, will be on display within the exhibition.

Beyond the main theme, other accolades awarded include gold, silver and bronze prizes in the Coloured Digital Photo and the Monochromatic Digital Photo Award; Creative Photographer Award; 'Future Image by Future Eyes' Youth Awards created by photographers under 16 years old; Best Photographer Award; and the Photography Clubs Award, which was awarded to the Emirates Falcon Photography Club for their group participation.

A jury of international experts including FIAP President Riccardo Busi (Italy) FIAP, Nicolas Berlingieri (Argentina) Executive Board Member, Director of the FIAP Education and Training Service and Guo Jing, the China Global Photographers Union representative, met in Abu Dhabi to evaluate entries. Jury members selected winners according to a rigorous grading system to ensure the winning pool met the highest technical and artistic standard.

A series of masterclasses and workshops for adults and teens will be held at Manarat al Saadiyat in conjunction with the exhibition, starting on March 28 – as part of the exhibition's opening programme – with an open discussion featuring Riccardo Busi, FIAP President and jury members as they discuss their experience in the competition, alongside prize winners who will discuss their winning photographs.

On Tuesday 29 March, three winning photographers – including the winner of Noor Ali Rashid Prize for the Emirati Photographer of the year – will talk about their experience in the competition.

Insightful discussions will continue on Friday 1 April, as a Master workshop titled *How to Create Imaginary Landscapes* chaired by Mr. Nicolas Berlingieri, FIAP Executive Board Member, will teach participants how to create imaginary landscapes and explore photographic techniques that can be applied to a variety of images.

On Saturday 2 April, the FIAP Training Course for Juries will introduce participants to the specific criteria juries employ when judging international competitions, including regulations, techniques, character, climate and atmosphere.

Both classes will be held in Studio 2 at Manarat Al Saadiyat, and the full programme and registration for all activities details can be found at www.emiratesphotocompetion.ae.

Additional specialised workshops, interactive meetings and seminars as well as individual and group exhibitions linked to the Emirates Photography Competition will be held at Al Marsam Al Hor in the National Theatre, and Al Qattara Arts Centre in Al Ain throughout April, May and June.

The Emirates Photography Competition exhibition runs at Manarat Al Saadiyat Exhibition Centre, Saadiyat Island, Abu Dhabi from 28 March – 13 July, 2016.
